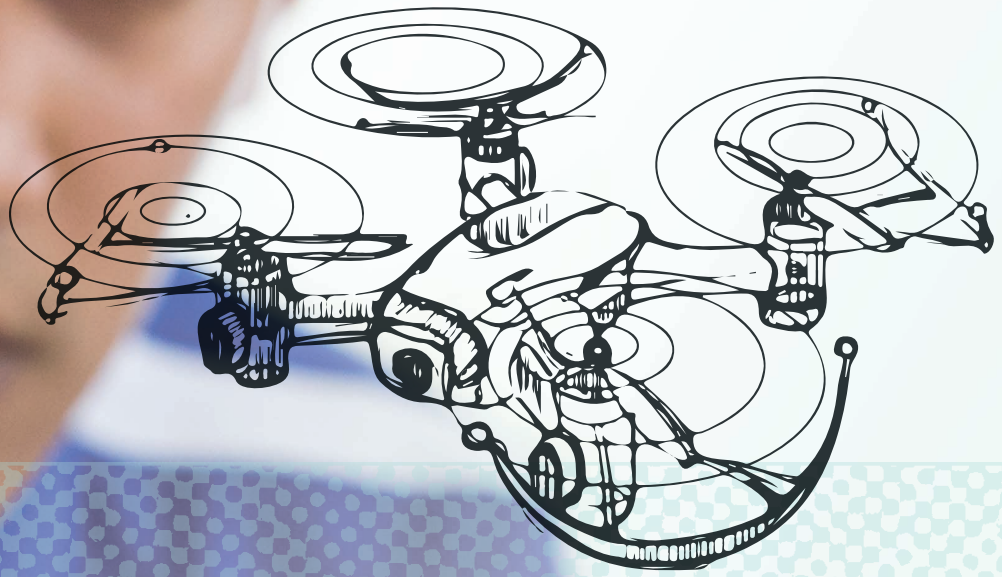

PaCE: COMBINING ONLINE AND RESIDENTIAL LEARNING

Pathway to Campus Enrollment, or PaCE, provides freshmen with the opportunity to start their UF degree online and then transition to campus in order to complete an undergraduate degree. Applicants are considered for PaCE through the regular freshman application. Only students who select a PaCE major on their UF application will be considered for PaCE.

With 60 majors in seven colleges, PaCE features our esteemed faculty and meets the same rigorous UF academic standards that students encounter on campus.

Students admitted to PaCE will complete a minimum of 15 credit hours and two semesters through UF Online. After completing a total of 60 credit hours and all prerequisite courses, students may request to transition to campus. admissions.ufl.edu/learn/pace

APPLYING TO UF



UF is a member of the Coalition for Access, Affordability and Success. Complete the Coalition Application and UF supplement by November 1, no later than 12 a.m. (midnight) Eastern Standard Time. Refer to admissions.ufl.edu to begin your application.

- On the Coalition Application, complete your Coalition Profile. For UF, you do not need to complete the coursework sections.
- Add the University of Florida to your College List on the Coalition Application.
- Complete your UF Application component of the Coalition Application by telling us about your experiences through high school.



Pay the \$30 nonrefundable application fee and \$5 processing fee or indicate fee waiver on application.



Arrange to have official ACT and/or SAT scores sent directly to UF from the testing service by December 15.



Submit and link the Student Self-Reported Academic Record (SSAR) to your UF application by December 1. The SSAR is located at <https://ssar.selfreportedtranscript.com/Login.aspx>.

Applicants who have completed a high school curriculum not patterned after the U.S. system or who are earning a GED should not complete the SSAR.



If you have studied at a high school outside of the U.S. for at least two years, refer to admissions.ufl.edu/apply/international for application instructions.



Check your status to confirm receipt of your application by UF. You can check your status 24-48 hours after submitting your UF application on the admissions website: admissions.ufl.edu. Use your Coalition username and password to check your status.

GATORS ARE CHAMPIONS. In sports. In class. And in life. On this campus, our hearts pulse to the beat of the Gator Chomp. We pride ourselves in having one of the top-10 best athletic programs in the nation. In our football stadium, known as The Swamp, more than 90,000 fans will rise up to the cheer “orange and blue” and later join arms and sway to a classic school song at the end of the third quarter.

POWERHOUSE ATHLETICS

UF became the first program in collegiate history to own both the men’s basketball and football titles in the same calendar year, after capturing crowns in 2006. When Florida won the 2017 NCAA baseball title, it became the sixth Division I program to win a national title in baseball, men’s basketball and football. Beginning with Florida’s 2008 football championship, the Gator Athletic program is one of four in the nation to win at least a national title each of the last 10 seasons. During this time, 14 Gator teams have claimed national title recognition.

Gator victories continue beyond The Swamp and into the Olympic Games. More than 180 Gators have represented 37 countries in 18 Olympiads. At the 2016 Olympics in Rio, Gator athletes brought home 13 medals, including eight gold.

INTRAMURAL SPORTS

Even if you’re not a varsity athlete, there’s plenty of opportunities to engage in sports activities. UF has 2,769 intramural teams with almost 13,000 participants. We’re home to two recreation centers, four pools, one golf course and our own lake for sailing, kayaking and wakeboarding.

INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY

UF enrolls students from around the nation and globe. Our international community is more than 6,000 strong and represents at least 150 countries. There are also approximately 2,200 visiting international scholars on our campus at this time.

The UF International Center serves two purposes: championing the study of the world at UF and representing UF to the world via study abroad programs. Some 2,200 UF students studied abroad last year in more than 100 destinations. UF ranks in the top 20 of leading institutions sending students abroad.

Recently, UF was one of only five institutions recognized with the Senator Paul Simon Award for the strength of our international study efforts.

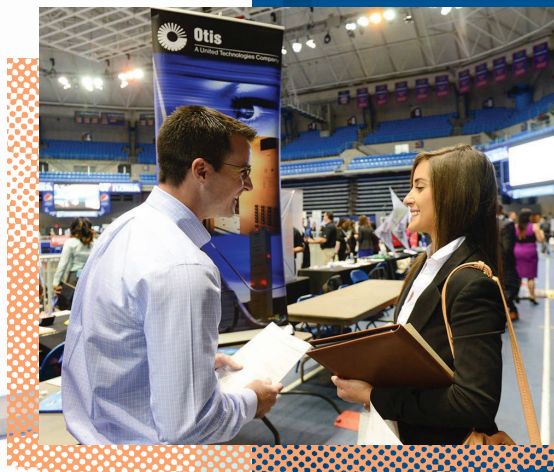

COMPLETE A FAFSA

You can file a FAFSA as early as October 1, 2018 for the 2019-20 academic year. Apply as early as possible at fafsa.gov.

NEXT STEPS

Although you must be accepted for enrollment at UF before you are considered for financial aid, students should apply for aid before being admitted. To apply for financial aid, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov starting October 1, 2018.

UF's "on-time" deadline to receive the results of your 2019-20 FAFSA from the federal processor is December 15, 2018. Apply well before December 15 to ensure that the federal processor has time to analyze and send the results of your FAFSA to Student Financial Affairs (SFA). Financial aid is awarded on a first-come,

first-served basis, so apply as early as possible to be considered for the most and best aid. In order for SFA to consider you for a financial aid package, you must be a degree-seeking admitted student and have met the "on-time" deadline. www.sfa.ufl.edu/prospective

One or more of the four types of aid (grants, scholarships, part-time employment, loans) are usually offered to eligible students to make up their financial aid award package. By early April 2019, admitted freshmen who have filed the 2019-20 FAFSA "on-time" will receive an official award notice online at one.ufl.edu.

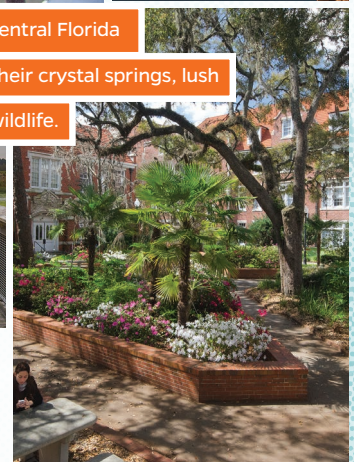
